### STAFF SUPPORT













From 2018 to 2024, our animal welfare advisor, Harold Browning was been based at **Hanoi Wildlife Rescue**Centre in an AAF capacity (Harry was based at HWRC supporting the work of Four Paws from 2016-2018).

Harry alongside our former animal welfare assistants, Duong (2018-2022), Cuc (2017-2023), Linh (2022-2024), Mai Chi (2022-2024) and Vy (2022-2024) provided advice and support to the management and staff at all of our government rescue centre partners, on all aspects of animal management including enclosure design, enrichment, husbandry, behavioural observations, disease prevention & screening, record keeping, veterinary and behavioural management, nutrition, and strategic development plans.


### BEAR ENCLOSURE IMPROVEMENTS

Our team have provided designs and supported the construction and furnishing of new enclosure structures at Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre to provide increased complexity and structural diversity within the bear enclosures providing opportunities for bears to exhibit more species specific behaviours



### BEAR ENCLOSURE IMPROVEMENTS

Our team are providing enclosure furnishings, daily enrichments and training for rescued bears at Hoang Lien National Park Rescue Centre to improve their daily welfare whilst we work with the centre to significantly improve their long-term management









Our experts are supporting bear integrations at supported facilities to provide social stimulation, improve individual welfare and ending the housing of solitary bears in small cages at Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre

### BEAR ENRICHMENT

Our team are supporting an ongoing enrichment programme for rescued bears at supported facilities to increase their daily activities and provide species appropriate challenges and opportunities











### **Bear** diets



Our experts have supported the Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre team to implement more varied, healthy diets for their rescued bears. Ensuring that diets are nutritionally valuable as well as satisfying for the bears to consume


Our team are supporting an enclosure improvement programme for birds at Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre providing additional perching, substrates and appropriate nesting materials within the bird aviaries



Our team designed and supported the construction and furnishing of a new aviary at Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre to house rescued raptors providing birds with space to fly and removing raptors from being housed inappropriately in small cages



Our team designed and supported the construction and furnishing of multi-species aviaries at Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre to house a variety of rescued bird species in species appropriate conditions







#### Aviary Design



For HWRC there are approximately 4 types of birds requiring 4 seperate habitat designs.

Sur team designed and supported the construction of a new aviary at Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre to house rescued psittacines in long term care prior to release, and temporary enclosures to provide immediate housing for birds following confiscations and quarantine. Enclosures have also been provided with nest boxes to provide parrots with a shelter and a place to hide out of view





Sur experts have designed and supported the construction and furnishing of a new aviary at Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre to house rescued hornbills, providing hornbills with dynamic branching and nest boxes



Sur team are supporting an enclosure improvement programme at Phong Nha Ke Bang National Park Rescue Centre providing additional perching and substrates within rescued bird aviaries



### Hornbill integrations

Our experts are supporting hornbill integrations at Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre and Phong Na Ke Bang National Park Rescue Centre to provide social stimulation and improve individual welfare









## Hornbill wild release

With funding provided by Nashville Zoo, our team supported **Phong Nha Ke Bang Rescue Centre** to complete the construction of a new hornbill flight aviary and provided support to **Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre** to transfer two hornbills to Phong Nha as part of a wild release programme







# Hornbill wild release

Two rescued hornbills housed at **Phong Nha Ke Bang National Park** have been released into the wild following habituation within a soft release enclosure


This release has been successful thanks to the coordination of a number of organisations including Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre, Animals Asia, Four Paws Vietnam, Nashville Zoo, Attica Zoo, Bronx Zoo, The Nabula Roselle Project, and the IUCN hornbill research group





### CARACAL ENCLOSURE IMPROVEMENT

Sur team have supported the furnishing of an enclosure at Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre to provide a rescued caracal with more species appropriate living conditions

### GIBBON ENCLOSURE IMPROVEMENT

Sur team designed and supported the construction of a new gibbon enclosure at Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre providing the vertical space and structural diversity needed to help meet the needs of rescued gibbons



### GIBBON ENRICHMENT

Our team are supporting an ongoing enrichment programme for rescued gibbons at Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre including the addition of dynamic branching to mimic the movement of branches the gibbons would experience in the wild and providing screening to allow gibbons places to hide from view









## Gibbon integrations

Our experts are supporting gibbon integrations at Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre to provide social stimulation and improve individual welfare



### LORIS ENCLOSURE IMPROVEMENT

barriers to help reduce stress for the loris at Hoang Lien National Park Rescue Centre caused by their current exposure, and provided furnishings and planting materials within their very limited cages. Our team are working with the rescue centre to provide more species appropriate housing in the future







### LORIS ENCLOSURE IMPROVEMENT

Sur team have increased structural diversity, provided sleeping boxes and regular branches and leaves to act as screening in the rescued Loris enclosures at Phong Nha Ke Bang National Park Rescue Centre, we have also ensured the loris are fed a species appropriate diet

These photos provide a snapshot of the living conditions for macaques at **Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre** at the beginning of our partnership













These enclosures provide structural diversity and natural climbing opportunities as well as providing individuals with opportunities to be out of view of others helping to reduce stress and tension within social groups



Our rescue centre team working with the Phong Nha Ke Bang Rescue Centre staff to build connective tunnels between the current macaque enclosures, providing the staff with the opportunity to improve the welfare of the rescued macaques by providing them with multiple opportunities to utilise the enclosure tunnels and to freely move between enclosures

Our team support the delivery of daily enrichment programmes for macaques at partner rescue centres
















# Macaque release

Our team in collaboration with Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre staff transported 25 macaques from a pagoda in Hai Duong to the Vu Quang National Park were they were quarantined, and males castrated prior to release onto an island habitat, with the national park staff providing supplementary food and monitoring their movements








# PORCUPINE WELFARE IMPROVEMENTS

Our team support an ongoing enrichment and enclosure improvement programme to provide more species appropriate living conditions for rescued porcupines at all supported facilities, providing logs for chewing, substrates for digging, covered spaces to allow individuals to hide from public view and so reduce stress levels, and new diet recommendations



#### REPTILE ENCLOSURE IMPROVEMENTS

Our team support an ongoing enrichment and enclosure improvement programme providing rescued reptiles with species appropriate features within their enclosures and opportunities for them to bask in the sunlight, removing them from previous housing conditions that were seriously impacting upon their welfare








## TIGER ENCLOSURE IMPROVEMENTS

Our experts have supported the design, construction and furnishing of a new enclosure at Hanoi Wildlife Rescue Centre to house rescued tigers, including safety fencing, multiple platforms, scratching posts and the provision of numerous enrichments








#### TURTLE ENCLOSURE IMPROVEMENTS

Our team are supporting an ongoing enrichment and enclosure improvement programme providing species appropriate living conditions for large numbers of confiscated turtles at supported facilities, this includes providing sheltered areas for turtles to help regulate their temperature







#### TURTLE QUARANTIN E AREA

Our experts designed and supported the construction and furnishing of a quarantine area at Hanoi Wildlife
Rescue Centre to house rescued turtles with support from the Turtle
Conservation Centre and have supported the centre to deliver health screening of newly rescued turtles, advice on handling, procedures for newly arrived turtles and emergency treatment to help them to recover from dehydration







# Veterinary training

Our experts are working in partnership with international vets and Vietnamese based NGOs to improve welfare for animals via veterinary and husbandry training of rescue centre veterinary staff







#### **Veterinary interventions**

Our team have supported numerous veterinary health checks and interventions to treat rescued animals including population management interventions to aid integrations and prevent breeding for tigers, bears, macaques and otters







#### ANIMAL TRAINING PROGRAMMES

Our team have delivered target training for bears, tigers and gibbons for enrichment, health checks and to aid shifting between enclosures





#### **Husbandry protocols**

Our team have supported staff to implement daily husbandry protocols for all animals to optimise their welfare and the safety of the rescue centre staff

Our team have supported the development of educational activities and promotional materials documenting the trade in wild animals and the relevant laws




